



2020 FEED APPEAL GRANTS

QUEENSLAND

The Feed Appeal's overall mission is for no Australians to go hungry.

Feed Queensland Appeal grants build the capacity and capability of local food relief charities to grow, expand and deliver their food programs and nourish the local community.

Grassroots, Major Projects and Rural grants are given to existing food relief charities who offer meal, food pantry and hamper programs to those experiencing food insecurity in the local community.

The grant applications are assessed by state based review panels who allocate 60% of the total funds to charities, with the remaining 40% allocated to FareShare.

FareShare is Australia's largest charity kitchens which rescues surplus food and cooks it into nutritious healthy meals which are distributed for free. The 2020 funding to FareShare in Brisbane will enable them to cook an additional 133,000 meals for distribution to local food relief charities throughout Queensland.

We are proud to award 8 grants in 2020.
